MINUTES

Chairman John P. Sivick called the meeting to order at 10:00 a.m. Also present were Richard C. Vollmer, Vice Chairman and Robert H. Rohner, Jr., Supervisor and Secretary/Treasurer. Robert F. Bernathy, Esq., Township Solicitor and Jon Tresslar, P.E., Township Engineer was not present.

In attendance from the Lehman Township Water & Sewer Authority was Peter Contino, Donald Karpowich, Esq., Authority Solicitor and Mike Gable, P.E., Authority Engineer.

In attendance from PA DEP were Bob Pitcavage, Brian Brusher, Colleen Stutzman and Brian Yagiello.

In attendance from Pennsylvania American Water were Dan Rickard, Don Kessler and John Yamons.

In attendance from Pennvest was Rebecca Kennedy.

SALT REMEDIATION PROJECT:

Mr. Gable gave a brief outline of the history of the salt contamination which began in 1991.

There has been a study of water quality.

The direction of the plume was outlined on an aerial map.

Six (6) months ago the Authority drilled a new well outside of the plume. Subsequent water testing showed higher manganese, sodium and other solids.

It has been determined, through testing, that the area has higher manganese, iron and chloride. Mr. Gable is not convinced that the township is solely responsible for the contamination.

The authority's proposed water system initially needs to supply 25 EDUs, but is being designed for 60 EDUs.

The service area covers 120 acres, with approximately twenty (20) customers, and there are one hundred (100) undeveloped lots.

The project will install 4,000' of service lines at a cost of \$400,000.00, with a total project cost of \$1.9 to \$2.1 million.

Discussion ensued regarding the possibility of Pennsylvania American Water Company connecting this service area to their service area located within Pine Ridge.

The representatives from PA American Water stated that the company is experiencing service problems within Pine Ridge, including the same water quality issues as the township.

Ms. Kennedy stated that grant funding is based on means to repay, and this area is not considered low

income. She further explained that there are four (4) application periods, February, May, August and November.

Applications are submitted on-line. A project must be 100% ready to proceed before an application can be submitted.

New and existing water supply systems apply.

Ms. Kennedy would need to research the scenario of the township receiving a Pennvest grant, and then the system being turned over to a private company.

A PA American Water rep. stated that if they were to take over the system, the company, through customer billings, would be able to refund a certain amount of money to the township for costs that had been incurred by the township.

Mr. Gable informed the PA American reps. that there is a fracture line that runs along the township's property and into Pine Ridge. This scenario may be an avenue that PA American Water can work with.

Senator Lisa Baker and Representative Rosemary Brown will be contacted regarding the possibility of funding through Commonwealth Financing.

Ms. Kennedy added that the township would need to pass an ordinance to qualify for Pennvest funding.

Mr. Gable then took the representatives from the three (3) agencies on a site visit of the project area.

ADDENDUM NO. 1 – BUSHKILL VILLAGE PLAN:

The recommended changes for the amended draft of the Bushkill Village Conservation Plan, as submitted by Bill Collins of Simone Collins, have been reviewed, and the supervisors have no changes.

Motion made by Mr. Rohner and second of Mr. Vollmer to direct Mr. Collins to finalize the new draft of the Bushkill Village Conservation Plan. Unanimous.

ADJOURNMENT:

There being no further business, meeting adjourned at 11:02 a.m. by the motion of Mr. Rohner and second of Mr. Vollmer. Unanimous.
